Planning & Zoning Update

- ▶ Zoning Permits approved since last meeting:
 - Zoning permit for 9500 Shenandoah Drive to replace a deck and add a wood deck.
 - Sign permit for 9484 South Congress Street Sona Bank.
 - Sign permit for 9431 South Congress Street The Buttercup.
- ▶ Worked with town attorney on the noise ordinance.
- ▶ Started working on ordinance additions.

Public Works

- ▶ Performed tree trimming on Congress Street.
- ▶ Assisted with tree removal in the town park, and planted the replacement trees.
- ▶ Completed street sweeping. Town wide cleaning.
- ▶ Landscaping and mulching of town facilities and streetscape on Congress Street.
- ▶ Continued preparation for the pool opening.
- ▶ Performed Regular Maintenance of Town facilities.

- ▶ Finishing up with the new SCADA system on wells 6 and 8.

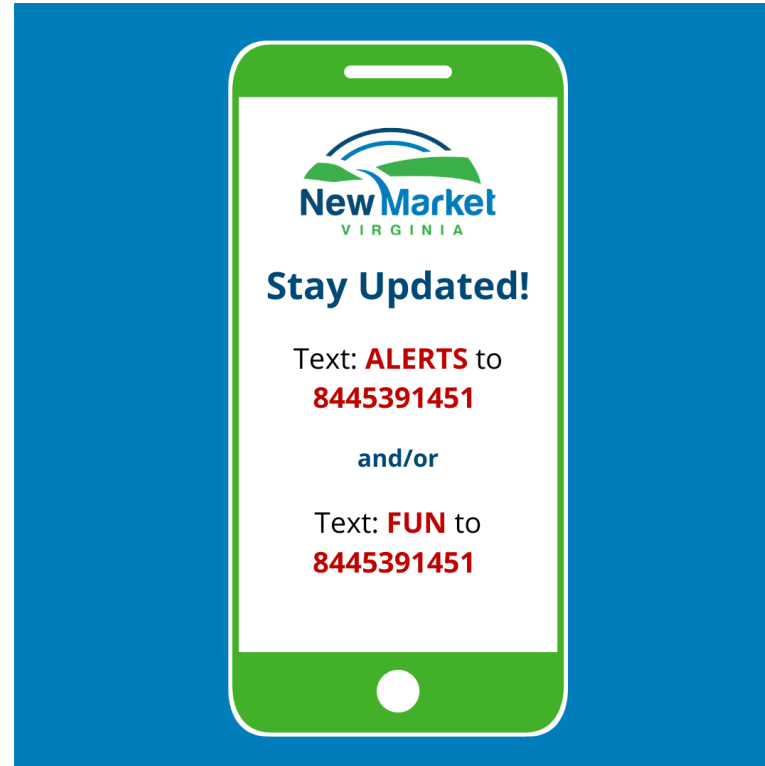
